I have just returned from our annual Area VIII board meeting where we finalized plans for the 2008 Festival Handbell Conference, **PEORIA RINGS MY BELLS!** We are all very excited about the Peoria Civic Center. It is a wonderful facility that has just undergone a huge renovation. Our conference hotel is the Pere Marquette. It is an ancient hotel on the Historic Registry. It too has just undergone a renovation. The rooms are very comfortable and the hotel boasts a full, free breakfast buffet. It is just a half block from the convention center. I think you will be very pleased with our choices.

As you know, our music selection was posted in the last issue of *Quavers*. Unfortunately, we have to make one change. I have since found out that the Bronze selection of *Festival Sanctus* is no longer in print. Because of this, we have had to choose a new piece. It is *Praise His Name in the Dance* by Derek K. Hakes. It is a new piece published by Alfred Publishing, level 4, and the stock number is MAP25358. I apologize for any confusion this has caused.

I am very excited about our clinicians. We have Hart Morris and Bill Alexander coming to lead us. Hart has been the Minister of Music at the Asbury United Methodist Church in Tulsa, Oklahoma for the past fifteen years. He is a former chair of Area IX, AGEHR. Among his many accomplishments, Hart is an internationally known clinician, a published composer and arranger and the co-founder of Red River Music. Bill has been the director of five choirs at the First United Methodist Church in Duluth, Minnesota for the past twenty-five years. One of his choirs is the touring ensemble, Strikepoint, which will be our featured Friday night concert. Bill is a former AGEHR officer. He is also an internationally known clinician and conductor and has a reputation for musicality and fun.

As usual, we will offer a wide variety of classes and opportunities. We will again be offering the Breakout Concert option for those who have taken more classes than they care to count. If you are interested in being a part of that, you can contact Past-Chair Marilyn Droke. These concerts will be about thirty minutes in length and will give your choir an opportunity to shine! If you would like to play something but don't want to give a whole concert, we will also offer the Showcase Concert. This is for choirs, ensembles and soloists who would like to perform one piece. I missed talking with colleagues. I enjoy talking with other directors about their programs. This is a great exchange of ideas that can only help me become a better director.

I missed the massed ringing. I like the sound that hundreds of ringers produce together; it just fills the room. One of my former churches had only a three-octave set of bells, so I always enjoyed the additional high and low octaves that bigger choirs brought to the massed ringing.

I missed the classes. As long as I've been involved in handbells, I learn something new at every festival. It could be a new teaching element, a different approach to the music, a better way to run a rehearsal. My ringers have the opportunity to be taught by some of the best handbell teachers. I don't know everything, and whatever my ringers pick up from the classes they attend can only make us a better ensemble.

I missed the reading sessions. Reading sessions provide an excellent opportunity to read through new music. It helps me decide what music to buy. I also encourage my ringers to go to reading sessions, and then tell me what pieces they would like to add to our library. They usually have some good suggestions.

I missed the shopping. Vendors often have special discounts for the festival, so I come to the event with a list of supplies and equipment. I can stretch my budget just a little farther.

I missed alot two years ago, and I do not plan to miss the 2008 festival. Join us in Peoria next June—you don't want to miss it.

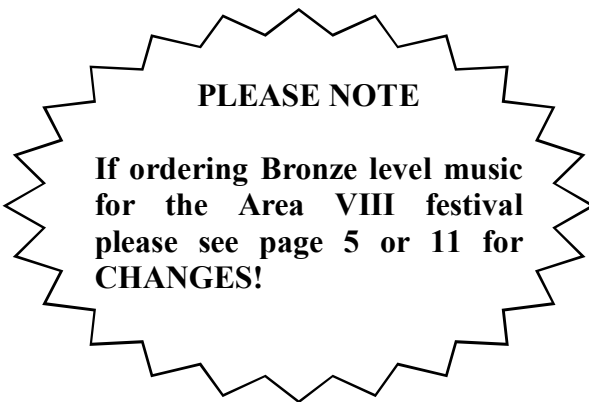
